Small beginnings, greater ends

I am back after 44 days walking the Via Francigena, south of Rome. The route is both ancient, going back to the Roman and Crusader times, and recently opened, in 2019, to modern pilgrims. Each walk has its own lessons and message. This one was particularly challenging, stretching and demanding, because of the terrain, the lack of signage, the weather and long distances. Yet, it had a unique depth and grace to it.

I encountered many angels along the way, people who welcomed me into their homes — a friendly smile, strangers providing assistance with accommodation and directions, the offer of a cup of coffee or a glass of water — all these angels leading me to Bethlehem, not in Pales-

tine, but in my heart.

Just like the angels who appeared and directed the shepherds in Luke's Christmas Gospel, these angels directed me to the tiny spark of hope and love that is there, like the holy Child, poor and vulnerable, at the core of humanity. Of course, there were Herods too, unhappy people who could only pass on their hurt and pain, people who took advantage of me as a foreigner. However, the angels outnumbered the Herods by far. As well as heavenly hosts, there was also the Italian country side, beautiful architecture, art, ancient churches and frescoes that pointed to the inner Bethlehem, the mystery within.

At a number of Masses, I attended on the walk, the Donovan song, "The Little Church," from the movie "Brother Sun, Sister Moon," was sung at the Offertory. This song became my theme, my Gospel and invitation, on the pilgrimage — "Go slowly, do few things and do them well, stone by stone, day by day, live life free and purely."

As we begin the Camino of Advent, in preparation of the feast of Bethlehem, I encourage you to look out for angels in your daily life, they are definitely there. Be attentive to the signs pointing to the Child of hope and light, sidestep the Herods, and, instead, become instruments of kindness, angels, doing fewer things well, stone by stone, building slowly the secret of Bethlehem in yourself, in others and in the poor, devastated Holy Land.
