Naming the New Year

On New Year's eve, at the New Camaldoli Hermitage in Big Sur, California, we'd hold a three-hour vigil, commencing at 9:00pm with Compline and culminating at midnight with vigils for the Feast of Theotokos, Mary, the God-bearer. During these hours of prayer, we borrowed from the Liturgy of Baptism, naming the New Year. Each person would light a taper from the Paschal candle, declare their chosen name for the year — hope, peace, reconciliation — then place the taper before the altar. By the end of the ritual, the chapel glowed with light and beauty.

The first day of the New Year is rightly dedicated to Mary, cradling not only her divine Child, but also the year ahead with its joys and sorrows, hopes and dreams. On my recent walk in the town Lecce, Italy, I found a little church near my lodgings. Inside was a Lady Chapel where people knelt in prayer and votive candles flickered. A simple 14th-century fresco depicted Mary and her Child. She was holding a flower while the Child had a bird, resembling a dove, in his hand. Called Mary of Grace, (Santa Maria della Grazia) it was an image obviously cherished by locals.

Visitors were encouraged to write requests in a worn book (see center column), to be remembered at Mass on each month's first Saturday. I penned your name, asking for prayers for all who read these words or make the retreats. The space emanated gentle peace, like a maternal embrace. May Mary accompany us into this new year and teach us to become Theotokos, bearing her son into 2024 amidst all uncertainty.

Happy New Year, may graces in abundance be yours.
