### Life after life

Recently I met a man who had a "near death," "life after life" experience. Listening to him was like attending a lecture on theology or Christology. With no experience of either discipline, he shared — tears running down his cheeks — struggling and groping for words to describe his experience. After an initial panic and darkness, he encountered light, welcome, acceptance, unimaginable love, embrace, and yet none of these words were adequate.

He became aware of Christ on the cross, arms extended, not in pain but in the same passionate, loving acceptance, radiating light and life which seemed to flow from him. The man shared how profoundly the experience impacted him and changed his life. This experience plunged him into an awareness of the oneness of everything coming from the Source of loving acceptance. It removed all fear of death and replaced it with a longing to experience loving, welcoming acceptance once again.

I have found myself returning to his sharing and coming to the realization that his "life after life" experience is also available to us. His encounter with loving acceptance and radiating light and life are simply terms for the divine dwelling in us, which we call the Holy

Spirit. Could we begin to live in the awareness of that loving, accepting, nonjudgmental presence within us, and open our arms, like Christ, in passionate, loving welcome? I'm certainly determined to give it a try.
