

Sparking the new flame

All of the month of May is "Easter Season," culminating in the feast of Pentecost on the first Sunday of June - so perhaps an invitation and opportunity to delve deeper into the mystery of the Resurrection.

I remember reading of a beautiful custom among Orthodox Christians a few hundred years ago, this was before electricity and even matches. The villagers went to great lengths keeping a flame alive in each household for light and fire. However, on Holy Saturday, the tradition was to extinguish the carefully guarded flame so there was darkness and no heat. The people then made their way, in the dark of night, to celebrate the Easter Vigil which began with the priest, using a flint stone, sparking the new flame and fire. After the lengthy service, each family went up to the Paschal Candle and took a flame home with them. Flickering lamps and lights spreading out through the village then illuminating the houses with Easter light.

A beautiful symbol, the Resurrection transferred, enlightening individuals and families. I remember something similar, in South Africa, with German priests and sisters, how they would bless, at the Vigil, gallons of water so each family could fill a bottle and take Easter water home with them to bless their homes, crops, fields, animals, everything was sprinkled with blessed water – a spark or sprinkle of Easter symbolizing not only Christ's resurrection from the dead but that new life in us.

Remember what Meister Eckhart said about Christmas, "If Christ is not born in you Christ is not born at all." Well, I think, we could say the same of the Resurrection. If Christ is not risen in you, Christ is not risen. What are those sparks or sprinkles but beautiful expressions of the Sprit, who is the Risen Christ, indwelling us, warming and enkindling, refreshing and resuscitating us with new life and light.

This month let's guard, protect and share the Christ spark in us, let's douse and baptize everything with the Easter water of reverence, kindness, thanksgiving and praise. Christ is risen, he is truly risen, Alleluia.
