

### A call to generosity and gratitude

I have just returned from Southern California, after giving a weekend retreat on Thomas Merton. We closed with Eucharist and anointing of the Sacrament of the Sick. One of those who came forward for anointing was young woman who was about to donate part of her liver to a teenage boy, after having previously donated a kidney to a young mother.

After the anointing and Mass, I thanked her for her unusual courage and generosity and asked what prompted her to make such an offering. She responded very simply that she felt called to give life and share her body.

For those who had eyes to see and ears to hear, this was the real conference of the retreat, not the five talks I had offered on Merton over the weekend. Here too was Eucharist. The young woman used exactly the same words to describe her motivation that I used at the Consecration, "This is my body given for you."

A little later, the woman's mother came to thank me for anointing her daughter and shared how the procedure is potentially as high-risk for the donor as it is for the recipient. She also explained that recipients and donors remain anonymous, so this was a pure gift, a pure offering from the young woman. The encounter of daughter and mother remains with me, nourishing and challenging. On the flight home the words of Thomas Merton, reflecting on his experience at the corner of Fourth and Walnut in Louisville (Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander), which I had used during one of

the conferences, revisited me:

"It is a glorious destiny to be a member of the human race, though it is a race dedicated to many absurdities and one which makes many terrible mistakes: yet, with all that, God Himself gloried it in becoming a member of the human race. To think that such a commonplace realization should suddenly seem like news that one holds the winning ticket in a cosmic sweepstake...There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun...There are no strangers!... If only we could see each other (as we really are) all the time. There would be no more war, no more hatred, no more cruelty, no more greed... I suppose the big problem would be that we would fall down and worship each other...The gate of heaven is everywhere."

I can still see that young woman's eyes clear, calm and open and hear her matter-of-fact response, "I feel called to give life and share my body." Remember her and the young teenage recipient, may they prompt us to generosity and gratitude.
