

The perfect time for "self-tuning"

The late Thérèse Gagnon was an oblate of the community who lived at New Camaldoli Hermitage in Big Sur for 38 years. I recently had the privilege of accompanying her to the banks of the Jordan at the venerable age of 96. It was a graced but demanding experience for Thérèse as well as those who supported her on the final leg of her life journey.

Over the weeks, Thérèse shared, among many things, her love for a film she watched 54 times, the final viewing just before she died. The movie, As it is in Heaven, a Swedish production directed by Kay Pollak, won the Foreign Film Award in 2004. The film tells the story of Daniel, a world renowned symphony conductor, who, after suffering a heart attack, is forced to retire at the peak of his career and decides to return to the rural village where he grew up. The church choir immediately solicits his assistance. Instead of listening to their singing and repertoire, he explains how each person is like a musical instrument with its own unique sound or note. Further, how vital it was that each member of the choir discover their personal sound so that the choir would become a musical instrument in perfect harmony.

As the members find their notes, joy, laughter and exuberance are released, but also their discord and disharmony become obvious, personal and communal. The choir members embark on a journey through dissonance to harmony, each eventually finding their voice and new freedom.

I won't share any more, in case you decide to watch the movie. However, the message has remained with me—the call to push through my own disharmony, again and again, so as to be able to "sound myself." Daniel, who is one of the Christ figures in the film, encourages the choir members to cling to their notes that they may not be overwhelmed by disaccord. Surely a message for today.

With awe I watched Thérèse claim her chord in the face of pain, suffering and dying - a note, I'm sure, she sang with gusto as she crossed the Jordan into the Divine embrace.

This seems the perfect time for "self-tuning" so we may discover, not only our note, but inner harmony and be an instrument of peace and hope, making our little corner of the world "as it is in heaven."
